- PhD students with DIA funding You will need to perform 20 hours of teaching duties for the department each
 week during the semester. You need to enroll in CS 7309 in the first semester for your first year. CS7309 usually
 meets at 10 am on Friday. Dr. Ngu will email you regarding the assigned duties during the first week of the
 semester.
- PhD students with DRA (research assistantship) will need to work 20 hours in research for the sponsoring professors. Contact your sponsoring professor to discuss the duties.
